## V. Committee Reports

ACF Report provided by Dr. Christopher McClain:

- ACF met 4/25/25 via Zoom
- Joseph Jenkins of HEPC General Council spoke about the SB 474 ("DEI bill") and other relevant bills passed in the recent meeting of the State Legislature.
  - Gov. Morrissey has not yet signed any of these bills so no new action/discussion was proposed
- Dr. Chris Rasmussen, HEPC Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, visiting state institutions to discuss academic leadership regarding
  - Common course numbering for core gen. ed. courses at community colleges
  - 60+60 policy and structure to increase transfer rates of credits from Associates to Bachelors degrees
  - o Gen. Ed. structure
  - Microcredential program development
- Dr. McClain asked whether Dr. Rasmussen was including faithful representation of diverse academic disciplines in discussion with academic leadership. Some programs (e.g., STEM) have prerequisite chains that present challenges to

one-size-fits-all structures. These challenges may not be insurmountable, but it is important to have representation from such programs in the discussion.

- Dr. Rasmussen said he would make sure discussions would take such issues into consideration.
- Majority of institutions will have new representatives in next year's ACF session.

- Introduction of WVU President Michael Benson
  - Welcome and intro with discussion of his background, importance of shared governance, and need for administration to be active listeners
- Chair Report, Dr. Diana Davis
  - Discussion of Faculty Senate elections which concluded in mid-April
  - Next year's Representatives for WVU Tech will be Rachel Bragg, Mark Jones, Kenan Hatipoglu, & Douglas Terry
- Faculty Representative for State Government
  - HB 3279: Bill removing for faculty and student representatives on WVU Board of Governors passed. In executive session, it was mentioned there was still Gov. Morrisey will not sign bill
- Faculty Senate Chair-Elect Candidate Statements

- Revisions to Faculty Evaluation, Promotion, and Tenure Guidelines
  - Revisions to document were passed, including amendment excluding Tech faculty from requirement for outside evaluations for promotion and tenure
